Dr. Parag Kachalia - "Digital Dentistry–Are We There Yet"



ABOUT THIS COURSE:

The world of dentistry is evolving at an unprecedented rate. Practitioners are being bombarded with advertisements claiming that digital dentistry is here and that the analog methodologies we are accustomed to are fading away. The course will take a critical look at the current world of dental technologies as it relates to the restorative arena with close attention to the current marketplace of digital impressioning units and chair side restorative milling systems. While examining the in-office CAD/CAM technologies you will also get an overview of lab-based technologies that allow dentists to offer new materials without a large investment. This course will allow practitioners to understand the future of digital dentistry and realize their own interests. This course is intended for dentists, dental assistants and laboratory technicians.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- Understand the evolution of CAD/CAM dentistry over the last 5 years
- Understand the pros and cons of the major in office CAD/CAM technologies in the marketplace
- Understand the financial impact of investing in CAD/CAM technology
- Be given strategies to manage incorporation of these new technologies into clinical practice.

DR. PARAG R. KACHALIA is an Assistant Professor of Restorative Dentistry at University of the Pacific's Arthur A. Dugoni, School of Dentistry. He serves as the Director of New Technologies, Course Director for Fixed Prosthodontics and is a core faculty member within Pacific's prestigious complex and esthetic rehabilitation program. He is a published author in the areas of digital dental photography, digital fixed prosthodontics, and financial management. His research is primarily focused on advances of CAD/CAM dentistry as well as new technologies entering the restorative marketplace.

He has lectured nationally in the areas of adhesive dentistry, cosmetic dentistry, photography, CAD/CAM technology, fixed prosthodontics, and new concepts within local anesthesia. Dr. Kachalia acts as a consultant for many dental materials/dental technology companies and helps guide product development. Most recently Dr. Kachalia was asked to become a member of Pride's Technology Leadership Council.

He earned his DDS degree from the University of the Pacific in 2001 after earning his BS degree in Physiology, from the University of California, Davis in 1998. Upon graduation from Pacific he was asked to join the faculty and has slowly increased his academic involvement over the last decade. Dr. Kachalia has served in numerous leadership capacities at the university level and most recently was selected to be a fellow in the American Dental Education Association's Leadership Institute. Throughout his time in academia he has maintained a private practice geared toward restorative dentistry with his wife and fellow Pacific alum Dr. Charity Duncan. He believes his continual involvement in providing patient care as well as a role in academia has given him a unique balance that allows him to blend the best of both worlds. In his spare time he enjoys traveling with his wife and two year old son, Duncan.

We will discuss the esthetic and functional parameters of each material to facilitate appropriate material selection. An efficient and effective process for streamlining tooth preparation will be presented.



ABOUT THIS COURSE:

If you're still telling patients to, "Brush, floss, and use fluoride toothpaste" you're going to be surprised by the myriad of treatment options available today. *Streptococcus mutans* has more to fear than stronger fluoride and more of it, as dentistry embraces oral healthcare.

- Explain the role of commensals
- Implement disease management in practice
- Safely consume a variety of candy and sweet beverages
- Prolong the life of restorations in all patients

DR. BRIAN B. NOVÝ is the Director of Practice Improvement at the DentaQuest Institute, and an adjunct associate professor of restorative dentistry at Loma Linda University. He served on the ADA Council of Scientific Affairs 2010-2014 and as chair of the CMBRA Coalition through 2015. The California Dental Association Foundation presented him with the Dugoni Award for - "Outstanding contributions to dental education," and in 2009, the American Dental Association awarded Dr. Nový and his office the title, "Adult Preventive Care Practice of the Year."

Dr. Hans-Peter Weber - "Contemporary Implant Dentistry"



ABOUT THIS COURSE:

Implant Dentistry has become a common therapy that we offer to many of our patients. Research in the surgical and restorative aspects of implantology has contributed significantly to our understanding of the field and in many instances changed our approach to the treatment regimens that we offer. In this course, the treatment planning approach to implant therapy and techniques for optimizing esthetic outcomes will be considered and discussed.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- Discuss current radiographic, planning and surgical techniques in implant dentistry and demonstrate their clinical applications.
- Present the evidence for various implant loading protocols and demonstrate their indication for different clinical indications.
- Review important surgical and prosthodontic considerations, including abutment selection, to optimize implant treatment outcomes specifically in the esthetic zone.
- Discuss etiology, prevention and management of biological and technical complications in implant dentistry.


HANS-PETER WEBER, DMD, DR.MED.DENT., is Professor and Chair of the Department of Prosthodontics at Tufts School of Dental Medicine. He holds dental degrees from the University of Berne, Switzerland (1976) and the Harvard School of Dental Medicine (1990), as well as Certificates in Prosthodontics (1979) and Periodontology (1984) from the University of Berne. Besides his administrative duties as department chair, he is actively involved in research and teaching at Tufts and sees patients for dental implant and prosthodontic care in part-time private practice in Boston. He has contributed extensively to the scientific and clinical literature in the field of implant dentistry and is a regularly invited panelist at national and international meetings. He is a Co-Editor of "Clinical Oral Implants Research" and serves on the review boards of several other journals. Dr. Weber is a Past President of the Academy of Prosthodontics and currently serves as Vice-President of the Greater New York Academy of Prosthodontics. He is an Honorary Member of the American College of Prosthodontists and a Fellow of the International Team of Implantology (ITI).



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
